## The day arrives!


Today I woke up, took and shower, and was ready to go. - Amari

I can't wait to get off the bus to walk around and give my body some circulation. – JaRaya

We'll be on the bus for a long time but I can handle it. – Lamyjah

Today I slept like a baby on the bus and it was wonderful. - Ajanea

Thank you Ms. Tess and Amina for letting my sisters and I play on their tablets. And obviously I beat all of them. #Winner − Hinde (editorial comment: #Liar ⊕ - Ms. Tess)

Yesterday when we got to the hotel we had under an hour to have fun at the waterpark. ## Scenery


I love all the trees and all the nice land out here. I would love to have a house out here where it's so quiet...I like the mountains I see. – Tasheonna

## 9/11 – Flight 93 Memorial



Since today is Memorial Day, I remember my grandfather. He was always there for me. He suffered PTSD for 40 years after the Vietnam War. He was a strong man and I love and miss him so much. - Sara

It's Memorial Day today and today we went to see a memorial. – Tati

Today is Memorial Day. It's a little emotional for me because there are a lot of deaths in my family. For example, my brother died in the military and my grandpa died on 9/11. He was on one of the planes. – Nicoletta

The heroic passengers of Flight 93 attempted to seize control of the plane from the terrorist hijackers heading for a target in Washington, D.C....All those who died, died with pride and a purpose. - Lela

[I thought] it would be inside like a museum but everything was outside, which was pretty cool...The ranger from the site put a brief video in about Flight 93. I almost dropped a tear when I heard the woman's voicemail to her husband and kids. Her voice started to get shaky as if she was about to cry and that touched my heart. I can't even imagine how her husband felt when he heard that voicemail. How did he tell his children? I can't imagine that pain. I wonder how



many times a year their families come out to visit their graves. I wonder if the lady that left a voicemail for her husband, I wonder if her children are grown. If they were little when she passed away, I wonder if they remember her face, voice, smell, etc... - JaRaya

It was just sad to see. - Holly

A lot of people lost their lives on the day of that crash so I really want to take the time to thank God for letting me stay alive and be on this marvelous trip. – Jada

The girls, when I looked at their faces, they looked shocked about what happened... - Habiba

I can't imagine how hard it must be to make that call or leave a message for your loved ones saying you're not going to make it home or you don't know what's going to happen. My heart goes out to everyone's family who lost a loved one. – Devonna

Hearing all of this makes me appreciate more and more that I have both of my parents still alive and that I'm still alive. - Amari

We watched a video first. The video briefly discussed what happened with Flight 93. There was also a recording that made me a bit emotional. A flight attendant, Cece Ross Lyles, left a heart-wrenching message. She left a message stating how she was on a hijacked plane and how she loved her husband and



children so much. As I listened to the audio, I started to get emotional because I couldn't imagine the pain she went through leaving her family that message. – Elijahiana

The Flight 93 Memorial made me sad. They knew they were going to die either way, but they chose to stop the plane from hitting the nation's capital, which took huge bravery... - Sara

I think that the Flight 93 video was good and I learned something new. — Tasheonna

If I was in that plane I would be so scared cause I'm not planning to die on a plane...We went to the place where the plane landed and got to see all of the names on a wall. - Keray

The video made me really emotional...I think all of them were brave when they made the choice to take down the terrorists. - Aariona

It made me feel good to know people have courage. - Ajanea

A most tragic evet. I learned that it was a group of terrorists on a suicide mission. The target was Washington, D.C. but crashed in Pennsylvania. The plane was going 536 mph into the ground so there was nothing left but the bones, ashes, and [black] box. Those poor people didn't deserve that so I would like to pay my respect. - Fatuma

I never thought I would be so touched by something that has nothing to do with me...God bless that crew, passengers, and their families. - Desy

I learned a lot today. I didn't even know there was a fourth plane... I took a lot of... pictures. - Taylor



I learned even more about the terrorist attack. I am glad they have pictures, names, and DNA. Feel really sorry for the people on the plane. – Hinde

They are heroes because they saved the White House from being blown up. – Lamyjah

The Flight 93 National Monument is beautiful. What happened to those innocent people was not fair at all... - Destiney

It was sad because none of those people should have died. – Ossie

There were a lot of people that died. One that stood out to me was the woman with the unborn baby. - Tati

9/11 has left a huge impact on many people's lives in the U.S. To see the courageous passengers of Flight 93 fight, not for themselves but for many other lives that day, is purely inspiring and amazing. 9/11 impacted American lives differently from how it impacted Muslim Americans. Through my school years, I've learned that I have become a target for 30 pairs of laser eyes in my classes. Because my classmates believe they are "Muslims," and I am as well, that I should now be at fault. Even though I wasn't even in the country at the time. I am at fault because some idiotic "non-Muslims" believe it's OK to take lives, and also as easy as taking candy from a baby. My sophomore year of high school I joined the Poetry Club at my school, and I wanted to emphasize and write [about] how I feel about terrorists and their actions – how their actions have impacted and destroyed the Islamic image...Now all Muslims are believed to be terrorists. I wrote a poem called "Dear Terrorists" and it was a huge success. I won my bout with this poem, scoring scores of 9.3, 9.6, 9.8, 8.4, and 9.0! This poem I wrote because it not only captured my feelings and disgust towards terrorists from a Muslim perspective, but for all 15 million Muslim voices around the world. By winning my bout, I got my team to qualify for the semi-finals. My poem was very powerful and many people have come up to me to comment on it. They really weren't expecting or ever heard a terrorist poem, or any type of Muslim girl rejecting fellow members of her religion. My poem...:

Dear Terrorist,

I'm tired.

I'm tired of others hearing Islam and assuming terrorism, Muslim and assuming terrorist,

Of feeling guilty on the anniversary of 9/11 – your celebration!

Every year I dread this day, wanting to disappear from history.

Two or three pairs of eyes shooting beams through my hijab,

A shield I use to protect myself from their judgments and questions.

As if people don't stare at me every day.

Expressions mixed with resentment and dancing all over my classmates' faces.

Saying your people did this.

Disgust simmering from below their skin, ready to explode because they think I am proud of the actions of a few individuals who've lost their way but still claim to be Muslim.

My head spins with the 9/11 pictures flying up on the smartboard.

Jumpers frozen in time.

30 pairs of accusing eyes condemning me to a person I am NOT.

The teacher's voice fades.

Then anger, helplessness, and misunderstandings boil up my blood like a volcano ready to explode.

Representing 15 million Muslim voices around the world, I want to yell

MUSLIMS ARE NOT TERRORISTS and

TERRORISTS ARE NOT MUSLIMS.

But the world won't listen.

The world can't judge Islam based on non-Muslims, non-Muslims who've fallen so far from the glorious tree of Islam that they have become food for the decomposers and shelter for the insects.

Islamophobes created Islamophobia and terrorists reinforced it.

Both motivated by hatred and ignorance, while trying to spread their distorted ideologies and fears at knife point.

How can I practice my religion when major parts of my identity as a Muslim were effaced?

WHO DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?

WHO DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?

You've snatched 15 million of our religion and you call yourself one of us?

You've taken innocent lives.

9/11 2001, nearly 3,000 people died.

2 planes swooping down like vultures who've spotted their prey.

LITTLE MUSLIM KIDS CAN'T EVEN PLAY WITH PAPER AIRPLANES because they are seen as TERRORISTS IN TRAINING.

### **Mount Vernon**





Today we had an amazing tour guide show us around Mount Vernon – where the father of our country, first president, and guy on the \$1 bill, George Washington, lived. - Hinde

I learned that Washington's house was built in 1775. - Lela

We learned a lot about George Washington's life, family, and how he felt about slavery. - Amina

[George Washington] died in his bed. – Lamyjah

Martha was in charge of the home. - Desy

George Washington often had travelers stay at his house. Washington's mansion had ten bedrooms. The beds would be filled with straw. – Tati

I am thankful for the people who actually helped us try to end slavery. - Fatuma


One thing that I did realize was that a quote on the wall said, "Assault of the Second [First] Louisiana (Colored) Regiment of the Confederate

#### The Holocaust Museum




I spent more time in the speaking room because hearing the stories of some of the victims that survived was emotional and brutal...Now that I have actually been to the


