


We went on airboats that were so loud that hurt your ears. But we put on headphones and that felt better. – Kami

It was very special to me because he carried his tribe and culture around on him with confidence and you could really tell he believed and was committed to his tribe. – Arianna

We met a Native American. He said some really interesting things. He said that the tribe in Florida is "extinct." I thought that was very sad. He also said that other Native Americans weren't treated fairly and that it "is still happening today." When I met him, he made me realize that there are many groups of people that aren't treated fairly. Before I met him I only knew about one group of people being treated unfairly. That made me realize that there are probably more people just like him that are teaching people about their culture and speaking up and sharing what happened. — Lacy

I really liked learning about the native culture. The guy was funny and he taught us how to kill an alligator... I am native so it's interesting being acknowledged by other natives. - Kendra

He says he loves sleeping outside...he feels at home. - Nicoletta

I learned a lot of things like how to say Omaha in native language. It's Oo-ma-háa and I like how they say it. And I would like to say "ninyay" to Girls Inc. for letting me be here and that is "thank you" in native language. It's nice learning new thing about different cultures. — Asnina

Hearing about the Native past was cool. I'm actually from the Cherokee tribe and I didn't know all of those tribes were extinct and how Miami is an extinct tribe. - Kaionna

We got to hear from a real Native American that talked about his tribe and how he uses his survival skills. It was interesting hearing about his culture and how he made his everyday utensils. – Ra'Quel



My family is Native & African but we're not that connected to our culture and I would love to know more about my culture and things related to it. - Janaya

It's important to learn about our history so we don't repeat it. - Asha

His mother came from a Canadian tribe and his father came from a tribe in Texas...He taught us 2 ways to hunt a gator. – Desy

He showed us two different ways to kill an alligator. – Jazlyn

He showed us the different parts of an alligator and which parts are good to use as armor. He told us that the softest part of the alligator is its belly. The hardest part of an alligator is its back and that's what they put on their legs for protection during [alligator] killing. — Lacy



It was really interesting how he's so skillful with his hands. He told us that everything he had on was handmade. I know that must have taken a long time. - Ariyah

When he told us about how he was a native survivor and that he can survive in the wilderness – that was actually cool because many of us aren't from here and we don't know how it really feels to survive and hunt because we are so used to the modern world where everything is handed to us or we go buy our fish at the market. – Habiba

I want to thank Ms. Bev for being helpful, respectful, and sweet. She's been nothing but loving and caring. - Araya



If it wasn't for Girls Inc, I wouldn't be able to learn new things being at the place where things happened instead of being in class and feeling sleepy. – Habiba


Ms. CT said girls from a prior trip in D.C. saw Dorothy Height. She fought for equal rights for both African Americans and women. - Jamia

Seeing the World of Coca-Cola was very cool and Red. The clip they showed for the tour was emotional and heart-warming. - Asha

I tried flavors from Greece (Fanta: pineapple), Italy, Korea (Sprite), and Latin America. The one from Italy was <u>DISGUSTING!!!</u> It made me want to throw up. The Greece one tasted like a Mexican drink called Jarritos: Pina. My favorite had to be from Korea. The Sprite was good but less flavorful than North America's.

I liked the STEM station where a woman told us about all of the science involved in making Coca-Cola. She said it was her first time working at that station. I thought she did a fantastic job – very

knowledgeable and enthusiastic. We were happy to be her guinea pigs that day. – Ms. Roberta

We got to go to the Coca-Cola store and OMG I don't even like Coca-Coal but it was so beautiful. We got to try different flavors of Coca-Cola and they weren't that and. They actually tasted pretty good. We also saw how they make Coca-Cola. It was pretty interesting. – Kami

We got to try over 100 different flavors of Coca-Cola. I learned a lesson doing that and it was don't mix all the flavors together. It will make your stomach hurt. Overall, today was a nice day. I learned a lot while having fun. – Ra'Quel

My favorite part was being able to take a pic with the super cute bear. – Aariona

When Coke was first released the most popular flavors were lemon, orange, vanilla, pineapple, strawberry, cherry, and chocolate. - Sakira

The funniest and most annoying thing was trying to get the secret formula. I should have known they wouldn't give it to us. - Fatuma



I tasted over 100 flavors from around the world. There was one that fizzed up your nose and one that hurt the back of my throat and tasted like hand-sanitizer. – Liz

We got to try different kinds of pops from different kinds of places. Most of them made me want to puke. - Jaiya

The worst [flavor] was Beverly. But the first continent I went to was Africa. They were all pretty good. I put them in second in best tasting. – Liberty

Some of them were nasty. Especially the one called Beverly which was from Italy. – Arianna

We spit out the nasty one...It was very fun. - Anisea

We tried one nasty pop from Italy and it was called Beverly. It tasted like hand sanitizer and I was thinking "who would drink this?" – Taylor M.

Some were good but others were awful. The worst was this soda called Beverly. It tasted awful. - Caroline

Trying pops from all over the world was very interesting. They had sweet flavors, tangy, sour, bubbly, and disgusting. And when I say disgusting, I'm referring to Beverly from Italy. It tastes like sour medicine you are forced to drink when you're a kid with a fever. Me, Habiba, Fartunay, and Famo decided that we'd take "shots" pf Beverly and on the count of three we'd all drink at the same time. Habiba counted and when she got to 3 everyone faked their shots but Habiba actually ended up drinking it which was funny. - Asha

I tried a lot of pops and some were nasty. – Angel

It was very adventurous as far as the flavors. My stomach started to hurt, but at least I tried the flavors from around the world. – Desy

The one I disliked...tasted like medicine...My most favorite was from Brazil. It had a nice fruity taste. – Habiba

I did not like Beverly...It tasted like hand sanitizer. - Lacy

There was so much pop. Bitter, sweet, watered down, strong, and nasty. – Kaionna

The Beverly one from Italy was so bitter and nasty. – Kendra

Some of those pops are disgusting. I was literally like "Ew. Why ate those even pops?" So far it's been a good day. I'm even friends with people I didn't even like at first. - Janaya

I'm all Coca-Cola'd out. – Haunnah

Most of the ones I tasted were nasty. Afterward my stomach hurt. - Mariah

Now we are going to get burritos, head to the hotel, and maybe swim. - Jazlyn

We went to a taco place and it was good. – Makayla

Tonight, we had burritos and I ate mine before we walked back to the bus. - Asia

I was proud of the girls' ordering ability at the burrito place. Forty-two girls ordering individualized burritos (extra rice, no beans, more beans, sour cream, no sour cream, jalapenos, etc....) is no easy feat. I told them to think about what they wanted so they would be ready to order quickly and confidently. And they did! – Ms. Roberta

I wasn't a fan of dinner today. – Desy





Ms. Hannah, a Girls Inc. volunteer extraordinaire who moved to Atlanta, came to have burritos with us and to take a dip in the pool. It was great to see her! – Ms. Roberta

I really miss my mom and sister. I also miss my lovely phone. I feel like I've missed so much. Facetime, calls, messages, and my friends. I just have to suck it up til then. - Jaiya



June 1, Day 7 – Birmingham Civil Rights Institute and 16th St. Church

Waking up this morning, I knew I had to wake up early and wake up my roommates so I can get to breakfast before 7:20 so I can ear. So, I knew I had to wake up at 6:00, get out the shower and brush my teeth and wear my clothes by 6:30, then wake up the rest of my roommates and tell them to get ready since they took a shower at night. Then clean up until 7:20 and well all go downstairs and eat. – Asnina

Today I had breakfast but I wasn't really feeling the food. – Angel

I woke up late again but that is my fault and my consequence is to not eat breakfast. - Asia

We watched **Black Panther** on the bus... It was a pretty interesting movie except for the fighting and killing people. – Kami

We watched **Black Panther**. It was really good and I enjoyed it very much. - Jazlyn

We are currently in Alabama and 41 miles away from Birmingham. I can't wait to get there. When I first thin about Birmingham I think about the church bombing and the little girls. And also the book I read in the fourth grade called The Watsons Go to Birmingham. It's a really good book. It's probably my favorite. There's also a movie from it. It takes you in the life of a black family who @ first didn't live in a racist state so when they moved to Birmingham things were different for them I don't know, you just have to read the book for yourself. - Hinde

The Birmingham Civil Rights Institute was breathtaking...we watched a film that lead us into the actual exhibit. – Desy

They have another name for Birmingham called Bombingham because of the bombings that were being brought to the South but mainly here. - Jamia

Today we visited the history-filled state [Alabama] and explored its most significant areas for black, white, and world history: the Birmingham Civil rights Institute, the 16th St. Baptist Church, and a park that memorialized the Civil Rights Act. Each place spoke the language of the people that stood there less than 50 years ago, the language of freedom. While I was watching the presentation video, it was difficult not to let my eye stray from the screen while they showed graphic photos of people during



slavery and even after being hanged by the KKK... Strong people that can speak about their hard past are the kind to look up to. Before I came on this trip, whenever someone would mention slavery, racism, black segregation, etc. I would get very uncomfortable or avoid the topic. Learning and standing where it happened helped me realize how real it is...This is real. Its still going on, too. But now we can speak out on it more because of our rights, maybe it will be easier to get rid of it. — Famo

I got to learn a lot of new things and collected a lot of new information about segregation between blacks and whites. At first, I was never interested about things like this, but after this visit at the museum I wanted to keep learning more. - Fartunay

What really freaked me out was the actual Ku Klux Klan outfit which was donate by an anonymous person. God forbid he was a part of it. – Taylor B.

I learned so many things today. In the march in Birmingham, over a thousand children were arrested. Ms. CT admired how much information that I had learned. Birmingham was the most segregated city. Seeing and hearing Martin Luther King stating the "I have a dream" speech – it was so empowering and inspirational. – Araya

When we went to the Birmingham Institute, it made me realize how REAL this type of stuff is. The history of black people is real and my generation hasn't experienced the super severe part of racism and certain things our ancestors were oppressed from. We deal with certain things but stuff I have heard and read is beyond disrespectful...The museum opened my eyes wider and made me think more. My friends and I even had a conversation about things that have been done or said to them out of racism. - Janaya

What really creeped me out was the KKK suit donated by the anonymous person. I hope everybody was able to see how lucky we are to live in today's world because it's not as bad as it was back then. We should all be thankful. – Hinde

During segregation and also through slavery, all blacks longed for was freedom and equality but also quality education. Today, so many people take education for granted whether it be just not wanting to learn or skipping or making it difficult for the teachers to teach. We have something our ancestors and grandparents longed for or was hard to get. If they did have the opportunity to go to school it was a challenge to get there. - Sakira

One of the first attractions I saw was School Days. White schools had more money, better buildings, newer textbooks, and teachers with higher pay... The black schools were overcrowded. In 1950, the average class size was 48 vs. 35 in white schools. That same year Alabama spent \$120 on each white child but only \$60 per Black. - Ariyah

On the tour one thing I noticed was the KKK outfit. I got nervous when I saw it. I just couldn't believe that was real. The outfit was yellow. The hat on the outfit had buttons going up to create the coneshaped hat. The rest of the outfit looked like a gown that went down to your feet. It also had a symbol with the cross on it. I noticed that the sign next to it said, "Anonymous Donation." It made me wonder if someone in the KKK gave it up. - Mariah

Some of the artifacts were very well detailed and it really touched my heart. When I saw the KKK own that made me really think about everything they did to us African Americans, like burning the crosses and lynching. During the short film they showed a black man being hung. That really got to me because it just not okay and should not happen at all no matter what their skin color is. Me and Kaionna had a talk towards the end of everything about the stuff we saw and how we felt about it. It was kind of a deep conversation so I started to tear up because it touched my heart a lot. - Arianna – Arianna

I got to see examples of segregation...along with the work young people during that time period did to fight for their rights. Just like the young people today speaking out against gun violence and school shooting. – Somer

I saw how the water fountains were when blacks and whites were separated. This institute is really touching my heart. Like it is really emotional. I shed tears because it's just so sad. I can't believe what black people went through. They went through so much for us to be where blacks are today. But things still happen to this day. One day I can do something to change this. - Kendra

It's one thing to watch a movie about [segregation] and another thing to actually see everything in person. - Fatuma



We saw a lot of things like the stereotype pictures. They were mainly black people with huge lips eating watermelon or taking care of another white many. They also showed the different water fountains and barber shops. What stood out to me was the KKK outfit. It made me emotional but I just sucked it up because this is real and we can't change the past. And it also makes me think about the racism today because I am African American and I do live in a neighborhood considered for whites. But I'm not going to let it stop me. My skin color is beautiful and I know that. - Kaionna



I think it's important to recognize how lucky we are for all the sacrifices our ancestors made. - Asha

We looked at bus segregation, school segregation, and water fountain segregation. – Nora

Ms. CT told us that her grandfather used to switch the signs on water fountains which would automatically lead to death if caught. – Desy

They have a writing about Rosa Parks sparking the bus boycott which played a role with other women who helped

organize it. Also, we just watched the movie [on the bus] about Rosa Parks and just saw a beautiful model of her sitting on the bus where she refused to give up her seat. - Jamia

We saw two different models of classrooms, the blacks and the whites. White classrooms were so different than blacks. The white classrooms had bright lights and metal desks with white boards. The black classrooms had dull lights and wooden desks with chalk boards. The whites also had tile floor while the colored had wooden floors. – Ra'Quel

The number one story that shocked me was the true story of Emmett Till. I found out that he was brutally beaten by a group of white men until he was dead and his head was thrown into a river... It was because a white lady said that Emmett whistled at her but soon after his death she pleaded guilty and told the truth that he never did. – Asnina

Some other interesting exhibits showed how African American communities thrived even through segregation and unfair treatment. - Caroline

My favorite thing in the museum was the blood mirror. It represents all the gay, bisexual, and transgender men who weren't allowed to give blood even though it could save over 1 million people annually. Here as a mirror filled with blood. There was a mirror filled with blood. That way people had to look at themselves in the blood. — Liz

Gay people weren't allowed to donate blood until 2016. That surprised me the most. - Mariah

Me and Lady Bug [Alaijah] made a video about what we believe in. - Annielia

I really like how they had a station where you get to express how you feel, the rights you stand up for, etc.... I can totally relate because I too have been in a march. It was before Donald Trump became president and it was a rally downtown. I was so scared but I knew I was doing the right thing. The police later came and even started shooting it with paint things. They





hurt really bad. I know it's no where near as bad as the march with the shooting, water spray, and dogs but it's just as scary for both situations. Period. Nobody should ever have to feel like that. - Hinde

It makes me really sad when I see how our people were treated. I just feel that they never deserved anything they got. I always think about what I can do to bring attention to our people. All I can do is better myself, get out of my comfort zone and do things others wouldn't do. It all starts with me. I can make the change and I will. James Lawson said, "We will accept the violence and the hate, absorbing it without returning it." To

me that means that no matter how much hell people put you through, you can take it and make that your motivation to make a difference with returning the hate. #BlackLivesMatter – Ra'Quel

For the first time, I saw MLK give his "I have a dream" speech. It was really cool because I had the opportunity to stand where he stood in D.C. A few years back Girls Inc. went to D.C. Girls Inc. is helping me grow tremendously and showed me life outside of the Midwest. I'm very grateful. – Desy

Birmingham tried to tear down the blacks emotionally, physically, mentally, and spiritually such as engaging activities like the KKK, bombing, and Jim Crow laws. But the black community refused to give up because they believed and had hope that one day the rainy days will be over and the sun will shine bright and they'll be "free at last." Black communities also when to church and sang songs in search of hope. I can relate to that because whenever I'm feeling down or I'm in my feelings, listening to my playlist always makes me feel better. During the tour, I got to see some spooky items such as the bus the Freedom Riders rode that was attacked and set on fire...I also saw the items that remained on one of the little girls who died during the Baptist Church bombing. They displayed the rock that was found in her skill which I thought was really uncomfortable to look at. Seeing that kind of stuff made me thankful for being born in this era. Although we still have racism today, it isn't as bad as back then and we aren't as segregated. – Asha

I had heard about "Jim Crow" but I didn't know where it exactly came from. It came from the title of a well-known minstrel song performed by White men in blackface. I learned more about the stereotype side of things. On postcards, calendars, tobacco tins and toys, the images featured huge red lips, over-sized hips, big eyes, and hair standing on end. - Ariyah





There was a glass case that had items that belong to Denise, the girl that was in the church bombing. There were shoes, the brick that was in her head, bracelet, little book, and two purses. Those items were on her when they found her body. – Jamia

I learned that there were 6 kids who dies the day of the Sixteenth St. Baptist Church bombing. 4 girls who were killed from the bomb and 2 boys who were killed by bullets later in the day. One of the boys was riding on the handles of his older brother's bike when he was hit in the chest by 2 bullets from a white boy and his friend who were also riding their bikes. - Jazlyn

When we went by the [16th St. Baptist] church I felt all kind of chills which was crazy. – Asnina

They won't let anyone go inside for respect purposes. Across the street was a memorial for the 4 little girls. The oldest one was fourteen and the youngest was eleven. All were killed in the bombing...I didn't really realize how bad segregation was back then. "If you don't get out of the box you've been in, you wouldn't understand how much bigger the world is." (Angelina Jolie). That kind of applies to his because my mom always told me about how bad segregation was but I never, like, experienced it from an African American's point of view. - Liz

When we got to Memphis we checked into the hotel and went to an amazing bbq place. I got ribs. According to Asia, Memphis is partially known for BBQ. I didn't know that but I guess you learn something new every day. – Liz

We went to a BBQ place. The food was delicious. I also gave the woman a \$5 tip because she looked stressed but she made sure we got all our food right. - Kaionna

June 2, Day 8 – National Civil Rights Institute & Motel Lorraine in Memphis and City Museum in St. Louis

The place itself is just so beautiful it gives you chills. - Hinde



My first "ah" moment was the structure made out of bronze. It was naked humans outlining the United States. It refers to the struggle of others to help move up in life. - Desy

I wanted to say what the sculpture meant [to me]. The brown one with the naked bodies climbing on it. What I thought the statue symbolized was that even in our divided country, every equal being has the same goal of reaching the top. Some people may be higher than others but no one truly has any more power than the person at the bottom. – Famo

I could not help but notice the sculpture. When you first look at it, it shows how we

are all connected and how we all struggle together as one to become whole and be equal. – Taylor B.

As we walked through the door there was a sculpture. At first, I didn't think anything of it but when our tour guide started explaining what it meant and how it showed the climb of people to get to the top I realized the world will never stop stepping on you unless you get to the top. It angers me to think the world is this way and how hard free blacks had to work then and still do. – Asia

All of the artifacts and audio recordings let me be there in the 1960's watching Martin Luther King and other fighters bring justice to black people. - Somer

We got to see a timeline of the beginning of slavery to the end. Slaves were kept at the bottom of ships and packed together like sardines. Some didn't make it due to poor conditions. – Asha

In 1760, one male salve could be purchased on the Guinea Coast for 6 ounces of gold or the equivalent of: 2 muskets, 40 pounds of gun powder, 1 anklet, 5 pieces of cotton cloth, 2 iron bars, 1 copper bar, 4 pieces of linen cloth, 1 pewter basin, 20 pounds o cowrie shells. - Ariyah

I was mad when I saw the slaves chained on the floor of a ship. I almost cried but I remembered to stay strong and keep my head up just like them. - Anisea

One of the exhibits I found most interesting was the one about slavery and how everyone but the slaves benefitted. It talked about the North made money from stocking and creating slave ships. And how the South had been gaining the most amount of money from cotton production. — Caroline

I remember reading about the Dred Scott case and a lot of the stuff I saw I



remember learning in my African American history class. I love to learn about history. It's really my favorite class. I take a history class as an elective every year for school.... I think it is important that we educate ourselves and others about this and not just blacks but all races. This is America. - Janaya

There was...a movie we watched about the struggle for and to freedom. - Jamia

This museum was so beautiful. It has 25 exhibits...I learned the motel was owned by a white couple in a black area. Business wasn't going too well. Then a black couple bought it making it the only black owned motel in Memphis. – Desy

I can now say I stood where MLK once did. – Vic'Taijah

Walking through the Lorraine Motel – it gave me the shivers. The church music playing made me feel like I was at a funeral. It is an honor as a child to see MLK's last day on earth. At first, I thought it was fake because he was a pastor and there were cigarette butts until Somer told me that he did smoke cigarettes which was very surprising. – Taylor B.

I learned from the tour guide that people stopped going to that Motel because Martin Luther King died at that Motel. I like that instead of taking down the Motel completely, they made it into a museum. - Lacy

We had the opportunity to see the hotel/motel Dr. King got shot and killed at. The motel was named Lorraine, named after a black couple that bought it from white people. – Ra'Quel

We got to see where Dr. King got shot at his motel building, room 306. It was a very heart-chilling moment. – Fartunay

Seeing his hotel, it was like, dang, it really happened right there. I'm grateful for being able to go on this trip because some people won't get the opportunity I have by being a Girls Inc. member....I love learning by being outside of school because it seems like I have a whole other mind I didn't know about. Learning can be fun, especially if it is something you are interested in. – Kendra

A cool thing about this museum was the motel was the museum, they just remodeled everything. I liked that the museum had different time periods in different parts and areas. When you get to the hotel part, I was really touched by what I saw. The [plaque] we were reading said the stuff he did before the shooting. He was just a normal guy, talking to his friends and telling jokes. It even said that he asked the band to play his favorite song and they were playing that song in the museum. – Taylor M.



We saw where James Earl Ray was when he shot him. James was in the building across from the motel hiding in the bathroom when he shot MLK in the neck. -Jazlyn

I felt very sad. - Dahrma

My favorite exhibit had to be the bus. We were able to sit and hear audio of a white bus driver yell for a colored woman to move. – Desy



...he told us to get off the bus before we got arrested. - Ebony

In one exhibit they had a model of one of the sit-ins that happened during the civil rights movement. - Jamia

The most interesting part of that tour was when we got to see where MLK was assassinated. It was a sad visit. There was a little circular bouquet in his room, 306, there were 2 queen beds, 3 cigarette trays, a tray of food in between the beds, and a glass of some sort of soda or maybe beer. – Liz

My favorite part was when we went to Martin Luther King's motel room. I that was so cool how they left the room how it was when MLK was killed. I actually learned that he smoked cigarettes a lot. I also learned where he was shot because they don't teach us a lot in textbooks. Then we went to the museum across the street. That was the building where shots were fired to Martin Luther King's motel room. He was actually shot on a balcony inf front of his room. - Mariah

The teachers let us pick out a t-shirt. I picked out a black shirt that said "You can kill the dreamer, but not the dream." And I LOVE it! I want to thank the teachers for getting those for us. – Nora

The staff let us each pick out a shirt. I would like to take a moment to thank them. Thank you so much for putting up with 42 teen girls and then buying us stuff. - Liz

It was fun hanging out with someone new which was Haunnah. She's a great person to be around, great energy to have fun with. – Asnina

... Me and Lacy were drawing each other and I think mine turned out pretty well. - Nora

In St. Louis we went to the coolest museum I have ever been to. I felt like 6-year-old Desy again. I was able to crawl and climb in small areas. But my knees were a reminder that I wasn't that young any more...I even got stuck at one point and my friends had to pull me through a hole. - Desy

Today we went to the City Museum and it was very fun. There were a lot of things to do. – Makayla

That was the best museum I have ever been to...Me and my group went to the caves. It was so fun. The caves were a little scary because some of them were so little and you weren't sure if it was a cave or not. I had the time of my life because I love climbing. — Mariah

The City Museum had so much art and it was very creative. – Taylor M.

It was basically a huge playground for adults...A lot of the stuff seemed recycled which I think is amazing because it is always better to reuse than to waste. There were a lot of holes and crawling places you had to get through which was very uncomfortable yet fun for me. - Asha
